It is recommended that Items 1 through 4 be moved upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools.

1. Donation to Van Derveer School

RESOLVED that the Board of Education accept a donation from the Somerset County Municipal Youth Services Commission for \$4,000.00 to fund the Girls on the Run Program. The program will be coached by Jennifer Osborn and Danielle Mattia and will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from March 2012 to June 2012. All costs for the program are paid through the Commission.

2. Change Orders – Van Derveer Lighting Replacement Project

RESOLVED that the Board of Education approve the following change orders related to the Van Derveer School Lighting Replacement Project: (Attachment NB-1)

TSUJ Corporation – CO-01

Extend range occupancy sensors and dedicated power packs for 24 classrooms. This change order shall be charged against available General Repair allowance and results in a zero net change against the project contract award. \$13,429.43

TSUJ Corporation – CO-02

Cancel unexpended portion of General Repair allowance. Credit: \$11,570.57

3. Change Order – Van Derveer Limited Roof Replacement Work

RESOLVED that the Board of Education approve the following change orders related to the Van Derveer School Limited Roof Replacement Work: (Attachment NB-2)

Safeway Contracting, Inc. CO-01

Installation of additional metal counter flashings at two roof top HVAC curb units and removal and replacement of approximately 75 lf of rotted wood fascia and edge trim members. This change order shall be charged against available General Repair allowance and results in a zero net change against the project contract award. \$800.00

Safeway Contracting, Inc. CO-02

Cancel unexpended portion of General Repair allowance. Credit: \$4,200.00

4. Approval of Summer Programs June 2012-July 2012

RESOLVED that the Board of Education approved the enclosed list of Summer Programs June 2012- July 2102. (Attachment NB-3)

5* Contract Award Somerville High School Toilet Room Upgrades

WHEREAS, on January 18, 2012, the Somerville Board of Education (“Board”) held a public bid opening for the Toilet Room Upgrades at the Somerville High School project (“Project”); and

WHEREAS, the Board received eighteen (18) bids at the public bid opening; and

WHEREAS, the lowest bid was submitted by Jeral Construction Company, Inc., Bloomfield, New Jersey, with a base bid, inclusive of a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5,000.00) General Repair Allowance, of Eighty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$89,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the Board, upon consultation with its Design Professional has determined Jeral Construction Company, Inc. to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the above recitals are incorporated herein by reference; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby awards a contract for the Toilet Room Upgrades at the Somerville High School project to Jeral Construction Company, Inc. in the amount of Eighty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$89,000.00), which amount includes a General Repair Allowance of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to all but the three (3) lowest bidders; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes its construction counsel to prepare the contract for the Project, to submit same to Jeral Construction Company, Inc., and to obtain all documents required thereby; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the receipt of the executed contract, Project bonds, insurance certificate and any other required documents from Jeral Construction Company, Inc., the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to the remaining bidders. (Attachment NB-4)

6* Somerville High School Music Boosters Association Donation

RESOLVED that the Board of Education accept a donation to Somerville High School from the Somerville High School Music Booster Association in the amount of \$8,500.00 for the winter guard 2012 paraprofessionals.

7* Travel Expenditure Resolution

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined that the school district travel expenditures for the attached programs are in compliance with State travel guidelines as established by the Department of the Treasury and within the guidelines established by the Federal Office of Management and Budget; except as superseded by conflicting provision of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes and in compliance with the district policy on travel; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby approves the attendance of the listed number of school board members and district employees at the attached training and informational programs, and the costs of attendance including all registration fees, and statutorily authorized travel expenditures, provided that such expenditures are within the annual maximum travel expenditure amount. 8* Eliminate the Vote on the Annual Budget and to Move the Election Of School Board Members to the General Election in November

WHEREAS, Public Law S3148, Laws of 2012 provides that a local school district may adopt a resolution to eliminate the vote on its annual school budget that is within the statutory cap imposed by the State of New Jersey, and

WHEREAS, the above legislation provides that the above action would require districts to hold their annual election for school board members in November during the regular general election, and

WHEREAS, the Somerville Board of Education has determined that the statutory restrictions on the local levy tax increase for annual school appropriations is appropriate and sufficient to control and maintain a thorough and efficient education for the children of Somerville, and

WHEREAS, the Somerville Board of Education, consistent with the budgetary restrictions expressed above, believes that dispensing with annual school budget votes will save taxpayer dollars, and

WHEREAS, the Somerville Board of Education believes that school board member elections in November will attract a far greater number of voters than typically vote in April elections, and

WHEREAS, the Somerville Board of education believes that the elimination of the vote on the school budget and the movement of the board member election to November is in the best interest of the Somerville community, and

WHEREAS, the Somerville Board of Education understands that this decision shall remain in effect for a minimum of four years,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Somerville Board of Education does hereby determine that it will eliminate the vote on its annual school budget which shall be within the statutory cap and become effective for the 2012-13 budget, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Somerville Board of Education does hereby determine that the election of school board members will occur at the annual general election in November, 2012.
