Required Assignment:

The Gilded Age: America was on the threshold of the twentieth century—a time of widespread violence, fantastic wealth, political corruption, dismal poverty, growing labor unrest and financial panic. At a time when men and women as diverse as Jane Addams, Theodore Dreiser, Thomas Edison, Samuel Gompers and Frank Lloyd Wright—could all gaze in wonder at the magnificence of the White City, but there were many serious flaws beneath the opulent surface of American society. The World's Columbian Exposition came at a time when both our country and the American people were undergoing a profound shift from an isolationist, small-town, agrarian nation into a mobile, activist, and urban and mobile population.
